**SUBJECT:** Review & Approve **Resolution 2017-**\_\_ to dissolving Finance and Budget Committee and Citizen's Oversight & Budget Committee.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Approve Resolution 2017-\_\_ dissolving the Finance and Budget Committee and Citizen's Oversight & Budget Committee.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The Finance and Budget Committee ("Finance Committee") and Citizen's Oversight & Budget Committee ("Oversight Committee", collectively "Committees") serve advisory roles to the San Miguel Community Services District ("District") Board of Directors ("Board"). The Finance Committee consists entirely of two members of the District Board. The Oversight Committee consists of two District Community members. The Committees have no independent authority to take any action and can only recommend action to the Board. Staff recommends dissolving the two Committees due to the redundancy created by having multiple advisory committees serving the same role with no independent authority. The type of business considered by the Committees will be most efficiently carried out when done so by the Board without the Committees.

The Board does not need two committees to advise the Board with regard to the budget and can streamline District business and encourage efficiency by eliminating the Committees. Given that District community members may appear before the Board with regard to the Final Budget when the Board considers the budget, the Oversight Committee is redundant and unnecessary. Moreover, the Finance Committee creates redundancy by consisting of two Board members to provide recommendations to the Board.

Removing the two Committees will also relieve the workload of the General Manager, as he or she will not have to prepare and staff redundant Committee meetings. Moreover, two Board members may meet and examine an issue without the need for a formal committee. If the Board approves dissolving the Committees, future items that normally would have fallen under the purview of the Committees will go directly before the Board as part of its regular and special meeting agendas.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

The elimination of the Committees will not have an immediate fiscal impact but will likely lead to cost savings in the future through the reduction in staff time preparing for Committee meetings.

**SUBJECT:** Consider approving **Resolution No 2017-**\_\_ confirming the 2017 Weed Abatement Cost Report and Authorizing Collection of the charges on the County Tax Rolls.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Board of Directors approve the Cost Report for the 2016 Weed Abatement Program (Exhibit "A" to **Resolution 2017-\_\_**). After holding the hearing and making any appropriate modifications to the Cost Report, it is recommended that the Board adopt **Resolution 2017-\_\_** confirming the Cost Report and authorizing the collection of the charges on the County Tax Rolls.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

The San Miguel Community Services District Fire Department conducts a weed abatement program in accordance with the authority and procedures in Health and Safety Code §14875 et seq., as permitted by Government Code §61100(t). Staff is recommending that the costs incurred by the District to abate weeds from properties where the property owners have failed to do so be placed upon the tax rolls for collection.

When the District performs weed abatement work, Health and Safety Code §14905 provides that an account of the costs is to be kept and an itemized report prepared for the Board showing the cost of removing the weeds from each parcel. The Cost Report is then required to be posted on or near the door of the Board Chamber for at least three (3) days, with a notice of the time when the Cost Report will be submitted to the Board for confirmation. Staff has complied with these requirements and the 2017 Weed Abatement Cost Report is now being submitted to the Board for confirmation.

At the hearing, the Board is to consider the Cost Report and hear any objections (Health and Safety Code §14910). The Board may modify the amounts, as it deems appropriate, and then it is recommended that the Board adopt Resolution 2017—confirming the costs and directing that

the Resolution and Cost Report be submitted to the County so the charges can be collected on the property tax rolls.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

It is anticipated that the District will recover all costs incurred abating weeds in 2017 by having the costs placed on the property owners' tax bills.

**WHEREAS,** in 2017, in accordance with the procedures required by law, the District Fire Chief was directed to abate a public nuisance on certain parcels of real property located within the San Miguel Community Services District consisting of noxious or dangerous weeds growing upon said parcels and which have been abated under the power granted to the District by Health and Safety Code §14875, et seq, and Government Code §61100(t); and

**WHEREAS,** parcels in which the nuisance fire hazard vegetation was not removed by the owners, have been cleared and abated by the San Miguel Community Services District Fire Hazard Fuel Reduction Contractor, as approved by the Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, an itemized report has been prepared showing the cost of said weed abatement to be charged to each parcel, which report is attached hereto marked Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference as though here fully set forth.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Directors of the San Miguel Community Services District does hereby resolve, declare, determine, and order as follows:

- 1. That the recitals set forth hereinabove are true, correct and valid.
- 2. That said itemized report entitled "2017 Weed Abatement Cost Report" a copy of which is on file in the office of the San Miguel Community Services District and is available there for public inspection and also attached hereto as Exhibit "A" be and hereby is ordered confirmed.
- 3. That the District Clerk shall transmit a copy of this Resolution to the County Auditor.
- 4. That the County Auditor and the County Tax Collector be and hereby are authorized and directed to do all acts necessary and proper to place on the 2017-2018 Tax Rolls the respective assessments as set forth in said confirmed itemized report plus such administrative fees as are allowed under the law.
- 5. That as a result of said confirmation and recording of said itemized report, the amounts of the weed abatement costs set forth in said itemized report are thereby made special assessments and liens against the respective parcels of real property in the San Miguel Community Services District, all as set forth in said itemized report.


